RECIEPE OF THE MONTH

Lemon and Lime Panacotta with Poached Rhubarb (serves 4)

INGREDIENTS

- 500g double cream
- I lemon zest
- 1 lime zest
- 150g caster sugar
- 1½ leaves of gelatine
- 300g rhubarb
- 100ml cranberry juice

METHOD

- I. For the panacotta... soak the gelatine in cold water until softened. Boil the cream with 50g of sugar, lemon and lime zest, then take off the boil and whisk in the gelatine. Poor the cream through a fine sieve and into moulds. Refrigerate for 6 hours.
- 2. For the rhubarb... wash and chop the rhubarb, boil the cranberry juice and 100g of sugar. Place the rhubarb in the liquid and poach for 10 15 minutes. When cooked strain the rhubarb, reserving the liquid. Reduce the liquid until thick and syrupy.
- 3. To plate... place a spoonful of the rhubarb on the plate, place the panacotta on top, dress with the syrup and seasonal berries.
